

Stony Brook University, PCSAS accredited doctoral program in Clinical psychology

Effective July 1, 2024, federal regulation requires institutions of higher education to make a determination whether a Title IV eligible academic program that leads to professional licensure or certification meets the educational requirements for licensure/certification in the U.S. State where the institution is located and the U.S. States where “distance education” students are located at the time of initial enrollment in the program, as well as U.S. States where the program is advertised as meeting such requirements, and if applicable, the U.S. State where students attest they intend to be licensed/certified. The PCSAS accredited clinical psychology program at Stony Brook University is registered by the New York State Education Department and thus meets the educational requirements for licensure/certification for New York State and thus meets the educational requirements for licensure/certification for New York State. Through a good faith effort, and for the purpose of complying with the federal regulation, we have determined that the PCSAS accredited clinical psychology program at Stony Brook University meets the educational requirements for licensure/certification in the following U.S. States as listed in the table below; however, it is important to note that Stony Brook University is not the licensure/certification authority in these U.S. States and cannot assess whether an individual candidate will be issued a license/certificate in these U.S. States and instead each individual candidate must contact the licensure/certification authority in the U.S. State in which they are seeking licensure/certification to obtain guidance on the application policies and procedures for licensure/certification.

In addition to education requirements for the doctoral degree, many jurisdictions require post-doctoral (and other) professional experience. These requirements are beyond the curricular requirements described below.

Note that in some jurisdictions, in addition to being licensed as psychologist, an individual can obtain prescribing privileges. Stony Brook University’s program does NOT fulfill requirements for licensure as prescribing psychologists in those states and jurisdictions that allow for it. Typically, additional coursework in pharmacology is needed in addition to the doctoral degree. Please see the ASBPP website for information about other U.S. territories and Canadian provinces.

This list is a best-effort interpretation of state-level licensure codes.

Note: States followed by an asterisk (*) explicitly allow students from PCSAS accredited programs to apply for licensure; states followed by two asterisks (**) are in the process of changing regulations to allow students from PCSAS programs to apply for licensure. Being allowed to apply for licensure is not synonymous with meeting the curricular requirements.
