

PHI 630: Seminar in Continental Philosophy: Husserl and Derrida

Course Description:

Edmund Husserl, the famed “father” of phenomenology, attempted to write several “introductions” to phenomenology. This course is devoted to a close reading of the last of these introductions, *The Crisis of European Sciences and Transcendental Phenomenology*. One of the published appendices to this volume became particularly renowned through a commentary by a young Paul Ricoeur student, namely, Jacques Derrida. In conjunction with our reading of the main *Crisis* text and this appendix, we will study Derrida’s *The Origin of Geometry*.
